Come Home to Communion Outreach script

It's usually best to call people between 10:00 a.m. and 7:30 p.m.

If there is no answer, **don't leave a message the first time you call**. Try to speak to a person if possible. If you have time, call at least 2 or 3 times before leaving a message.

If you must leave a message, use this text as a guide:

Hello. I'm [name] from _____ parish. We want you to know we're thinking of you and hope you are doing ok [in these challenging times]. If you are in need of anything such as prayers, a ride to Mass, the sacraments or anything else, feel free to call me at _____ or call the parish office. Bishop Johnston [will lift on June 1 OR has lifted] the general dispensation and we invite you to Come Home to Communion and Sunday Mass.

We continue to follow local health guidelines and are taking precautions to protect those who prefer to continue to socially distance and wear a mask. Please join us if you can on Saturday evening at [Mass time] or Sunday at [Mass time(s)], or call to let us know how you're doing. God bless.
