

Diocesan Day of Prayer for Nature's Blessings

June 2, 2021

Following the ancient tradition of praying for God's protection in times of natural disasters (drought, flood, storms, poor crops), the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph has established a day of prayer to seek God's help during weather-related challenges or pandemics.

This day is meant to allow for various weather situations in our diocese. In some parts of the diocese priests might celebrate a Mass For Rain (#35), while others might pray a Mass For Fine Weather (#36) and still others For an End to Storms (#37) - Roman Missal. The Vatican has also recently released special Mass texts: In Time of Pandemic.

Outside of Mass, the book <u>Catholic Household Blessing and Prayers</u> provides prayers which can be used by households and small parish groups: <u>Prayer for Protection During a Storm, Prayer for Rain, Prayer for Dry Weather.</u> In June as food crops mature, we could also pray for protection from insect invasion and 'pestilence'. The <u>Book of Blessings</u> also provides scripture, intercessions, and blessings pertaining to the natural world.

Additionally, we might take time to heed Pope Francis' words to consider whether human activity has a part in nature's distress, first addressed in his encyclical <u>Laudato Si'</u> and in subsequent catechesis. We can pray the pontiff's prayers at the end of the encyclical: A Prayer for Our Earth or A Christian Prayer in Union with Creation.

Other than Mass, these prayers can take place out of doors when feasible. A suitable prayer environment can be created which might include candles, some holy water or other symbol of water (such as a scallop shell or attractive container with water), and objects from nature such as stalks of wheat or pine cones. If several individuals are involved, the prayer can be divided into parts. Suitable songs to begin or end include the following (sung a cappella): "For the Fruits of This Creation", "All Things Bright and Beautiful", "All Creatures of our God and King".



Prayer for Nature's Blessings

Introductory Rites

(*Leader*) God our Creator, the heavens declare your glory, and earth proclaims your handiwork. We praise you for the work of creation.

We praise you for the work of human hands. Bless us and help us in our work, bring us knowledge of our neighbors, our community, our world.

Give us wisdom and humility to be good stewards of the earth and of our days. Make us ever aware of all your creation and of our actions towards every living thing. We ask this through Christ our Lord.
