HOMILY



The *Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice* Cross is a papal award founded by Pope Saint Leo XIII on July 17, 1888. Initially intended as an award to mark his fiftieth priestly jubilee, it continues to outlive its founder. In present times the Cross is an award bestowed upon both laypersons and clergy who have given great service to the Church.



Pope Saint Paul VI especially loved modern art and altered the insignia of the *Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice* Cross established from the time of Leo XIII. Attached to a ribbon half yellow and half white, the heraldic colors of the Holy See, Paul VI replaced the papal effigy and medallion with a gold Greek cross.

In the center of the square cross are the images of the apostles Peter and Paul. On the cross bar of the Greek cross is the name of the award perpendicular to each of the Apostles' effigies. At the base of the cross is the papal arms in a modern stylized fashion.
